She understands that the car's rare beauty results


from unique construction; that body and frame are one, a welded steel structure, rigid, comfortable—*safe!*






Seats are like divans. You sit as on luxurious cushions. The angle of the seats completely rests the back. Arm rests are on both front doors, and in rear compartments as well.

This compartment holds three or four traveling cases or golf bags. The compartment is lined, is dust-proof and water-proof. . . . Additional tire is also enclosed in rear deck and swings out on specially constructed bracket.
