

AUTOMATIC HEAT AND FRESH AIR CONTROL

Just set the heater dial . . . the optional Automatic Control does the rest by adjusting to outside and inside temperatures. Here's how it works: heater blower goes on as soon as the water to the heater warms up. When sufficient heat is available, blower goes on full and stays there until temperature inside reaches 72°. Then it returns to low. A higher or lower temperature may be achieved by adjusting dial. Separate control operates defroster.

Regular heater and defroster optional on all models.



NEW BUICK AIR CONDITIONING

Let the temperature and humidity soar, you'll drive cool and relaxed with Buick-engineered Air Conditioning as your travelmate. The combination inside-outside air system filters out dust and pollen . . . removes cigarette smoke quickly. A new 20% larger condenser is so effective, full capacity cooling is seldom needed. Drive completely comfortable the full year 'round with Buick Air Conditioning. Optional on all models.



New Transistor Portable Radio—Like two transistor radios in one . . . a pocket portable to take outside the car and a high-performance car radio. To use outside the car, just remove the radio from its glove-compartment rack . . . it plays by itself with its own battery, speaker and antenna. As a car radio, just slip it back into position in the glove compartment (you can lock it if you like) and it plays on the car's electrical system, speaker and antenna. Optional on all models.

Estate Wagon, Electric Rear Window—Now you can raise and lower the tailgate window electrically without ever getting out of your new Buick Estate Wagon. DeLuxe Wheel Dials—Attractively embossed in chrome, with red Buick crest in the center. Standard on Invicta and Electra series, optional on LeSabre series.

Super-DeLuxe Wheel Dials—Embossed in a distinctive spoke and dimple pattern around a golden center design. Standard on the Electra 225 series, optional on all others.

Wide-Sweep Electric Windshield Wiper—Two-speed electric wipers clean way around the side giving you an even greater view of the road. A built-in windshield washer is included. Optional on LeSabre and Invicta, standard on Electra.

Rear Seat Speaker—Like high-fidelity sound? In car radio, Buick's rear speaker working with the front speaker comes mighty close to it. Control allows you to use either or both together. Optional on all models except the LeSabre and Invicta convertibles and Estate Wagons.

Power Windows—The driver can raise and lower car windows without stopping, without uncomfortable stretching . . . just by a touch of a button of the master control panel (located on the driver's door). Passengers have individual controls for separate operation. Optional on all models except LeSabre 2-door sedan, standard on Electra 225 convertible.

Estate Wagon Junior Rear Seat—Ideal for pre-teen children. Can be removed from car when not in use. Optional on LeSabre and Invicta Estate Wagons.

Automatic Eyes—Dim headlights automatically for approaching cars, brighten when they pass. Over-ride foot button allows regular dim-bright operation. Optional, all models.

Instrument Panel Safety Pad—Made of a cushioning material and covered with interior-harmonizing Cordavene. Optional on LeSabre, standard on Invicta and Electra models.
