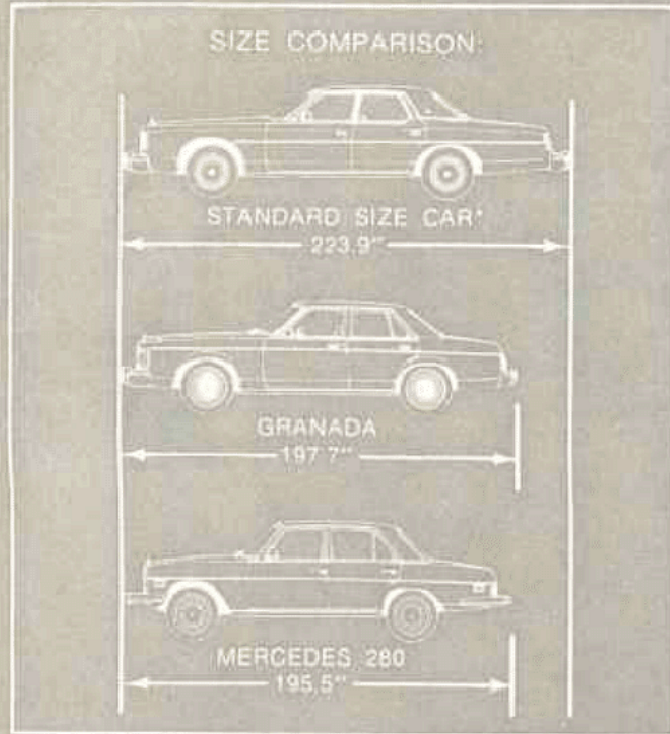

Designed to give you efficient use of space, fuel and money.

The design:

Granada is a functional car. Designed for driving as it is today. And built to keep cost of ownership low. Yet it is an elegant car—comfortable and a pleasure to drive.



Its trim size is new. Personal. About two feet shorter and half a ton lighter than most standard-size cars, so you can get good gas mileage. It's about the same weight as the Mercedes 280.

Five people can sit inside in comfort. Legroom and headroom, surprisingly, are comparable with standard-size cars. Generous glass area gives you good visibility all around. And the squared-off rear deck holds a trunk big enough to carry eight assorted pieces of luggage.

Granada also looks after your security. It has all of the big-car type Ford Lifeguard Design Safety Features found in larger cars like the Ford LTD. In short, Granada is designed to be functional and efficient.

The quality:

We subject Granada to hundreds of inspections while it is being built so it will reach you with a high level of quality designed into it. And we hope you will check the care we take to provide

quality fit and finish of body seams, doors and trim. Snug, flat carpeting. Uniformly lustrous paint. We also urge you to test-drive Granada's quiet ride—the solid road-holding feel. That's the best way to check for attention to detail on Granada, or any car. And Granada is so well-made, the closer you look, the better we look.

The construction:

Good body fits bear out Granada workmanship. Precision machinery holds body parts in tight alignment as they are welded into a solid unit. This provides good resistance to rattles. The tight, precise fit of mitred window frames on the 4-Door Sedan is another example. No crimp-on molding caps are needed as



cover-ups. Thirteen pounds of primers and chip-resistant baked enamel cover body parts to help resist rust.

The roadable, comfortable, economical Granadas.

Crisply styled Granada comes in a trim, efficient family-size with remarkable agility. You can pick either the 2-Door or 4-Door Sedan shown here.

The 109.9" wheelbase lets you turn in a tight 39.4-foot circle. Wide stance: 58.5" front, 57.7" rear, lets you carve curves and corners precisely. Hold the road in crosswinds. Enjoy a solid, quiet ride. That's roadability.



Granada 2-Door Sedan in Dark Red (Code 2M) has remarkably roomy interior with wide door for easy entry.

There's a classic new grille. Stand-up hood ornament. Bright rocker panel and wheel lip moldings. Wheel covers. Wrap-around parking lamps and wrap-around tri-color taillights. The 2-Door has smartly styled opera windows.

Under the beauty are proven standards like a 200 CID† Six with 3-speed manual transmission. Manual front disc brakes. Gas-saving, steel-belted radials, and more. See Notable Standard Features on page 5. Beauty, roominess, roadability, economy. All there. The closer you look, the better we look.

Ghia crests on 2-Door opera windows and on 4-Door center pillar vinyl appliques add elegance. So do paint stripes. And a left-hand outside remote control mirror.

Inside Granada and Ghia—rich, roomy comfort.

Interiors feature comfort and durability. *Granada*, at right, is trimly tailored in Silver Blue vinyl (Code AE), with pleated vinyl door panels. Nylon cut-pile carpets the floor. Burled walnut applique enhances the instrument panel. Front seats recline individually.

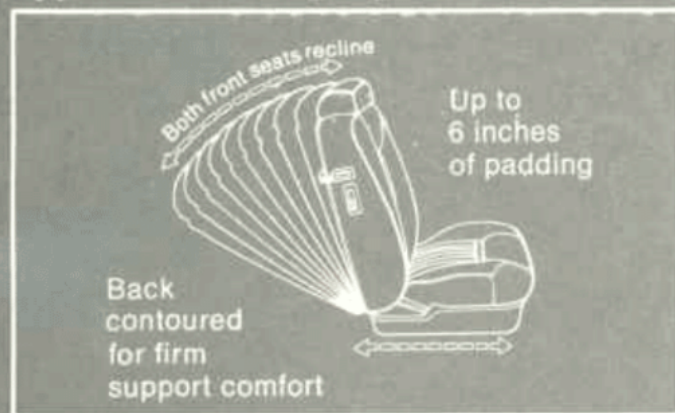
Ghia interior, below, has “floating pillow” seats, deluxe belts, 22-oz. carpeting and deluxe door trim. Assist handles on roof rails and seat backs (see inserts). Seat back map pockets, digital clock, luxury steering wheel, bright accelerator pedal trim and trunk dress-up are a few of many elegant refinements.

Super-soft vinyl is standard. Optional fabrics are 100% nylon knit cloth (with the look and feel of cashmere) shown in Dark Red, below, (Code DD), and Ultrasoft leather seating with vinyl touches. Very plush.



The comforts:

Granada offers a lot of pure driving pleasure. Both contoured, reclining front seats adjust freely enough to let you reach the pedals without crowding the steering wheel. Both seats adjust to more than 100 positions for your individual comfort. (A feature you'll especially appreciate on long trips.)



Supple vinyl trim is standard. Super-soft vinyl is standard on the Ghia. Ultrasoft leather seating and 100% nylon knit cloth with the look and feel of cashmere are available choices on Ghia.

The instrument panel, with its handsome burled walnut applique, is recessed to add to front passenger comfort. Controls are within easy reach. Plush nylon carpeting is stain-resistant. Weatherseal around doors and windows helps cut wind noise. Granada's tuned

suspension, tight body construction and sophisticated use of insulation result in a smooth, quiet ride.

The economics:

A luxury car today should earn its keep. Granada doesn't back away from that fact. Its trim design helps reduce needless weight and excessive fuel consumption. It comes with gas-saving, steel-belted radial tires that deliver excellent tread wear. And Granada calls for 5000-mile oil change intervals, chassis lubs only once every 30,000 miles and has 3-year**

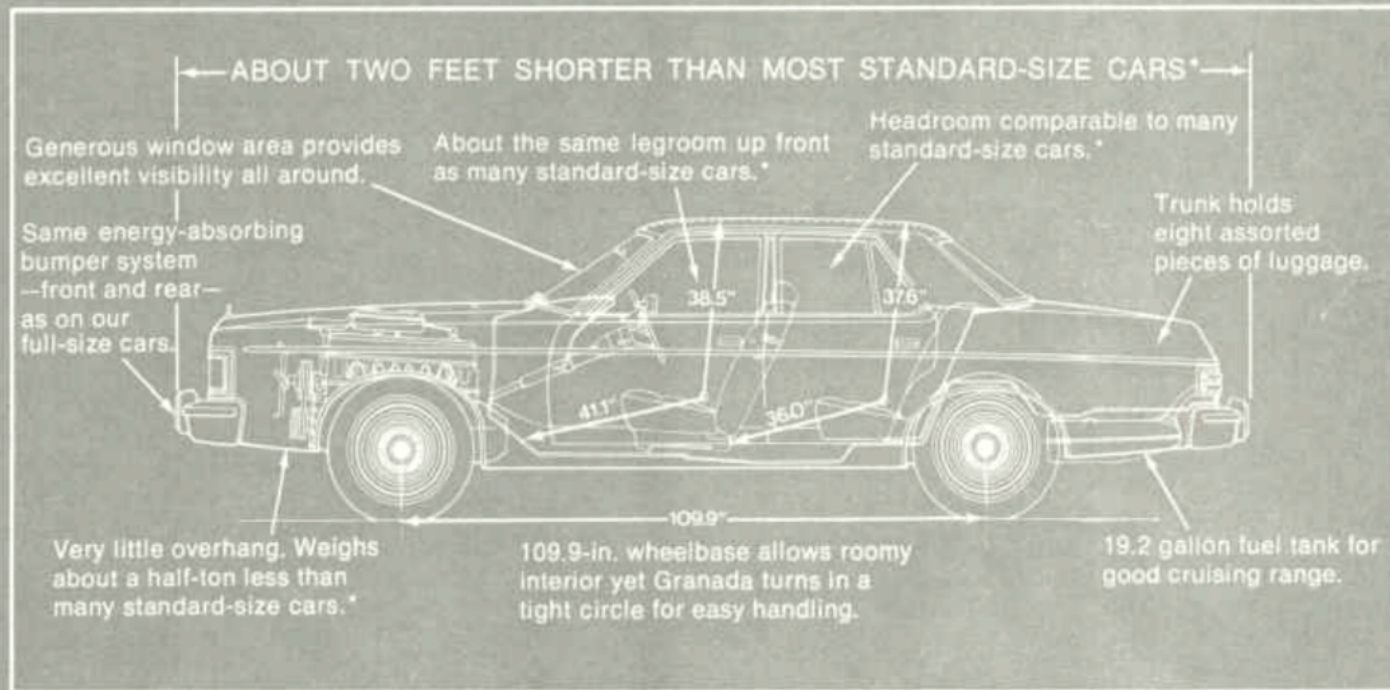
engine coolant antifreeze.

Even the engines make good sense. The standard 200 CID† Six on Granada, and the 250 CID Six on Ghia have small appetites. Optional 302 and 351 CID 2V V-8's are also economical. And all engines feature solid state ignition for less scheduled maintenance than former systems. What's more, the engines are carefully balanced to resist vibrations that can cause wear.

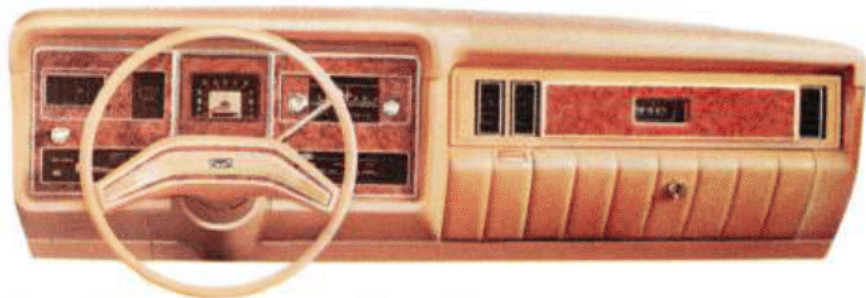
