STANDARD SAFETY FEATURES

- Explorer includes air bags for both the driver and front passenger (but remember, always use your safety belts).
- Power disc brakes at all four wheels are combined with a 4-wheel anti-lock braking system.
- Explorer's high-mount stop lamp employs ionized gas for enhanced visibility.
- The height of the front seat belt anchor points is adjustable for individualized comfort.
- The illuminated entry system turns the interior lights on when either front door handle is lifted or if any door is ajar.
- Childproof rear locks in 4-door models prevent accidental opening by curious little fingers.
- Speed-sensitive windshield wipers automatically wipe faster as vehicle speed increases.

RIDE & HANDLING

- Explorer's short/long arm suspension, com-

bined with its precise rack-and-pinion steering, offers improved ride, handling and steering over the previous model.

- The automatic 4-speed transmission includes a lock-up torque converter and is electronically controlled for more precise and consistent shifting.

- Explorer's available overhead console includes map lights, front and rear reading lamps, an outside temperature readout as well as a handy compass.


